



FACTS	WHAT DOES COPPER FINANCIAL NETWORK, LLC ("COPPER FINANCIAL") DO WITH YOURPERSONAL INFORMATION?
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	The types of personal information we collect can include: - Social Security number - Investment experience and assets - Income - Account transactions and holdings
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons Copper Financial chooses to share;and whether you can limit this sharing.

How does Copper Financial protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. In addition to physical and electronic safeguards, we have implemented security standards and procedures to protect your information, including	
	employee training, limited employee access and the use of confidentiality agreements.	
How does Copper Financial collect my personal information? Affiliates	Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

Nonaffiliates	Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can by financial and nonfinancial companies.	
	Copper Financial does not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.	
Joint marketing	A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.	
	 Our joint marketing partners include financial services companies (such as credit unions with whom we have agreements to jointly market financial products) 	





Other Important Information

California Residents:

Certain residents of California, in addition to other rights described in this Privacy Policy, have the following rights:

- To request that we disclose what personal information relating to you that we collect, share, or sell.
- To request that we delete certain personal information relating to you that we maintain.
- To opt-out from the sale by a business of your personal information.

- We may need to obtain information about you or your specific request to verify and respond. If you have an authorized agent, that person also may submit requests relating to your California privacy rights. We will need to obtain verification of the agent's identity, their authority to act on your behalf, and verification that you are the individual about whom Copper Financial possesses the personal information requested.

A business may not discriminate against a California resident that exercises their privacy rights under state law.

Vermont Residents:

In accordance with Vermont law, we will not disclose information about your creditworthiness to our affiliates and will not disclose your personal information, financial information, credit report or health information to nonaffiliated third parties to market to you, other than as permitted by Vermont law, unless you authorize us to make those disclosures. Nevada Residents:

Individuals in the European Union ("EU"):

Basis for Processing

Our legal basis for collecting and using the Personal Information described in this Privacy Policy will depend on the Personal Information concerned and the context in which we collect it. We collect Personal Information from you:

- where we need it to perform a contract with you;
- where the processing is in our legitimate interests (including the purposes described, above, in "How We Use Personal Information"); or
- if we otherwise have your consent.

Your Privacy Rights

Depending on applicable law, you may have the right to:

- Request access to Personal Information about you.
- Request correction of the Personal Information that we hold about you.
- Request erasure of Personal Information about you. Note, however, that we may not always be able to comply with your request of erasure for specific legal reasons which we will advise you of, if applicable, at the time of your request.
- **Object to processing** of Personal Information about you where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground as you feel it impacts on your fundamental rights and freedoms.
- Request restriction of processing of Personal Information about you. You can ask us to suspend the processing of Personal Information in the following scenarios: (a) if you want us to establish the data's accuracy; (b) where our use of the data is unlawful but you do not want us to erase it; (c) where you need us



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to hold the data even if we no longer require it as you need it to establish, exercise or defend legal claims; or (d) you have objected to our use of your data but we need to verify whether we have overriding legitimate grounds to use it.

- Request the transfer of Personal Information to you or to a third party.
- Withdraw consent at any time where we are relying on consent to process Personal Information about you.

Depending on where you live, you may have a right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority or other regulatory agency if you believe that we have violated any of the rights concerning Personal Information. We encourage you to first reach out to us at investments@cu.financial, so we have an opportunity to address your concerns directly before you do so.

Transfers to the U.S.

If you are transferring data from outside the United States, please be aware that Personal Information will be transferred to, stored, and processed in the United States. Although we take steps to provide adequate safeguards, the data protection laws of the United States might not be as comprehensive as those in your country.

We endeavor to apply suitable safeguards to protect the privacy and security of Personal Information transferred to us in the United States, and to use it only consistent with your relationship with us and the practices described in this Privacy Policy.
